

Rules for membership in T-RAX

General

- Members have prioritized access in the Fuse-lab between 17:00 -24:00 on weekdays and between 08:00-24:00 on weekends. No machines are allowed to be used between 00:00 and 8:00.
- To be allowed in the Fuse-labs you must have completed the general safety course **NOTE!** *you need an additional safety course to use the machines in each lab.*
- You are not allowed to let people that have not gone through the general safety course into labs.
- If an accident occurs resulting in personal injuries, contact the T-RAX board as soon as possible.
- Persons under the influence of alcohol or other drugs are not allowed in the workshop. It is forbidden to bring alcohol or other drugs into the workshop.
- Members are not allowed to manufacture objects with the intention to sell them or do work for money *if not authorized by the T-RAX board.*
- Manufacturing, renovation, or modification of weapons is forbidden.
- Members are not allowed to bring chemicals into the workshop. Except for the pre-approved ones that may be brought into the surface treatment lab. It is never allowed to store chemicals in the FUSE area.
- Members are not allowed to repair the machines if broken. Instead, report the damaged machine in the damage log.
- Only the T-RAX board or members appointed by the T-RAX board may hold safety courses on the machines.
- Materials provided in labs must be paid for when used for private use and must be paid for before use.
- No tools are allowed to leave the labs unless authorized by the T-RAX board. Which entails that you can not bring tools between labs.
- You shall always clean up after yourself. The last one to leave the lab is responsible for turning off the lights and power to machinery (except 3D printers).
- Food and drinks are not allowed in the lab areas.
- If something in the lab breaks you are obligated to report this to the school and the T-RAX-board by scanning the QR code and reporting what's broken and how it broke. Also, mark the machine that it's broken.

- All members are obligated to follow the rules and guidelines set by the school and student union.
- All members are obligated to follow and stay updated on the T-RAX regulations and “Code of Conduct”. The latest versions can be found on the T-RAX website.

The T-RAX board has the right to edit these regulations when needed.

- The T-RAX board has the right to take action if the contract, regulations or code of conduct are not followed. The action will depend on the rule violation and can be all from suspension to verbal warnings. If the violation falls under Swedish law, the violation will be reported to the Swedish police.
